Tuition

Families are required to submit a \$30.00 nonrefundable processing fee with the preregistration application. Upon Acceptance, camp tuition is \$670 (\$30 registration fee, plus \$640 for tuition) per camper. It is the family's responsibility to either ensure payment by the stated deadline or proactively make payment arrangements.

Camp DH is a non-profit; therefore, donations are tax deductible and always welcomed and appreciated.

Funding assistance for campers is available from various sources. You can contact your local chapter of the Arthritis Foundation or other similar lending agencies who, based on financial eligibility, may be able to provide monetary assistance in the form of a campership. Families must provide either written or verbal verification of campership award. Agencies who provide this type of monetary assistance will be billed separately.

Camp Dartmouth Hitchcock (Camp DH)

is a one-week residential summer camp experience for children with juvenile idiopathic arthritis as well as other inflammatory connective tissue diseases. Since 1983 Camp DH has hosted up to 53 boys and girls a year from ages 8 to 17.

At Comp DH campers enjoy traditional activities such as outdoor games, swimming, canoeing, and arts and crafts. In addition, communication and problem-solving skills are challenged through a series of structured activities, such as the ropes course. Campers are encouraged by their peers and staff to confront physical challenges that they believe they cannot achieve. This gives the camper a sense of accomplishment and self-confidence that they will keep with them year round.

Transportation and Communication

Unfortunately, Camp Dartmouth-Hitchcock can not be responsible for transportation of campers to or from camp. Please plan for your camper's travel with this in mind. While Camp DH does not require English to be your camper's first language, basic English comprehension is necessary for communication and safety. If your camper is from a non-English speaking household, accommodations can be made for registering your camper. To ensure an enjoyable experience for all campers and staff, we do ask that your camper has mastered basic English comprehension.
